Section I.

Opening:

This is personal. I, Doug Youvan, have lived through the corruption, violence, and lawlessness that plague Crawford County, Kansas. What I am sharing here is not just another story to be read and forgotten—this is my life. Over the years, I have seen the insidious nature of unchecked power, and I have borne the brunt of its violence. The scars I carry are a constant reminder of what happens when corruption is allowed to thrive in the shadows of small-town politics.

The violence I suffered, the systemic lawlessness, and the deep-rooted corruption in this small community have driven me to speak out and expose the truth. Stevie Pallucca, Tom Moody, Governor Laura Kelly, and President Joe Biden may seem like names from different walks of life, but in this tale of corruption and exploitation, their roles are interconnected. I name them not out of malice but out of necessity—because in a community like Crawford County, accountability is not a luxury; it is an urgent need for survival.

In this community, where power and control seem to rest in the hands of a few who operate with impunity, the consequences for those who dare to stand against this corruption are severe. I know this because I am one of those people. I was a victim, but today, I choose to be a survivor and a voice for justice. The injuries I sustained—documented in the very crime scene photos accompanying this article—are a result of the violence that was born out of local corruption. This was no accident. It was the calculated result of a community ruled by those who believe themselves to be beyond reproach, operating in a mafia-like fashion.

My survival through the brutality, the physical injuries, and the long years of recovery from addiction to painkillers are part of this war. The people behind these actions have names, and they will not go unnamed any longer. This paper is my stand—against the violence, the exploitation, and the rampant corruption that still festers in our community today.

Purpose:

This paper is not just about telling my story—it is a call to action. The corruption in Crawford County has left too many victims in its wake, people who have suffered in silence because they feared speaking out or because they believed there would be no justice. But I refuse to remain silent. This war against corruption must end, and the first step is to hold the individuals responsible accountable.

This paper names Stevie Pallucca, Tom Moody, Governor Laura Kelly, and President Joe Biden for the roles they have played, directly or indirectly, in allowing corruption to flourish in this community. These individuals, through their actions or inactions, have contributed to the environment that enabled violence and exploitation to go unchecked.

I hope this article will serve as a wake-up call not just for the people of Crawford County but for anyone who has experienced or witnessed corruption in their own communities. It's time to shine a light on the truth, no matter how dark or ugly it might be. Accountability matters, and this is our moment to stand up and demand it.

The people in this community deserve better, and so do I. Together, we must face this local war and fight for justice, transparency, and, above all, accountability. I write this not just for myself but for every person who has lived in fear, who has been hurt, and who has suffered because of the corruption that has poisoned this town. It's time for the people of Crawford County to reclaim their community and their future. This is our fight.

Section 2: Tom Moody – Nepotism and Violence

My Attack:

Tom Moody's reach in Crawford County extends far beyond the classic accusations of nepotism. What he has fostered in this town is a toxic, mafia-like influence that doesn't just stop at securing positions for friends and family—it delves deep into orchestrating an environment where violence is not only tolerated but implicitly encouraged. I experienced the worst of it firsthand.

At Moody's bar—an establishment that became notorious for its underage drinking, illegal activities, and the exploitation of young girls—I faced the consequences of this unchecked power. What began as a night of socializing quickly turned into a nightmare. Without provocation, I was brutally attacked, left bloodied, and permanently scarred—both physically and emotionally. The crime scene photos, which I include here not for shock value but to bear witness to the truth, capture only a fraction of the violence inflicted upon me that night. Those images cannot convey the pain I endured—the cracked cervical vertebrae that would leave me reliant on Oxycontin for a decade or the emotional toll that haunts me still.

This attack was not random. It was the culmination of years of impunity enjoyed by Moody and his cronies, who have long operated under the belief that they are above the law. For too long, their actions have gone unchallenged by law enforcement, local authorities, and even by members of the community who feel powerless in the face of such overwhelming corruption.

Living in Fear:

Tom Moody and his inner circle have made Crawford County their personal playground. What should be a community governed by justice and law is, instead, a kingdom ruled by fear and intimidation. The rules do not apply to them—they believe, and have reason to believe, that they are untouchable. Their influence runs so deep that even those who would speak out against them are often silenced, not by threats alone, but by the overwhelming feeling that nothing can be done to change the status quo.

For years, I lived in the shadow of that fear. I saw how Moody used his position not just to enrich himself and his close allies but to cultivate an atmosphere where dissent was met with violence. It wasn't just me. I saw the impact of his nepotism and lawlessness on others—how people felt powerless to change their circumstances, how young lives were ruined in his bar, and how law enforcement turned a blind eye to all of it.

But this paper is my stand against that fear. I am naming Tom Moody because no one else will. His actions, and those of his cronies, need to be exposed to the public for what they are: a deliberate abuse of power that has harmed this

community for too long. No more silence. No more hiding behind the veil of intimidation and small-town influence.

The people of Crawford County deserve to know the truth about what has happened under Tom Moody's watch. He has used his influence not to serve this community but to exploit it, to advance his own interests, and to brutalize anyone who dares to stand in his way. It's time for that to end.

This is not just my story—it's the story of a town that has been held hostage by corruption. And it's time to shine a light on it. The public deserves to know, and more importantly, to take action. This is my stand against the corruption and violence that Tom Moody represents. I survived, and now, I speak out—not just for myself, but for every person who has suffered in silence under this reign of terror.

Section 3: Governor Laura Kelly – State Involvement in Corruption

State Neglect or Complicity?

Governor Laura Kelly may not seem like the obvious player in the corruption that plagues Crawford County, but the web of influence and neglect that extends through Kansas reaches higher than just local governance. When we speak of the allegations involving biological warfare and human trafficking, these are not isolated, small-scale crimes. Trafficking rings often operate across counties and state lines, requiring more than just local corruption to facilitate their activities. While it is not being claimed here that Governor Kelly herself is directly involved in such heinous acts, her administration's responsibility cannot be overlooked. At the very least, the question of state-level neglect is worth asking. How much does Governor Kelly know about the criminal networks operating within her state, and what actions has she taken to stop them? If her administration has not acted swiftly and thoroughly to investigate and root out these activities, then she is complicit in allowing these atrocities to continue.

There are two possibilities here: either there is ignorance, which in itself is a form of negligence, or there is a deliberate decision to not intervene, which is a far graver crime. The people of Kansas deserve to know which it is. They deserve transparency, and more importantly, they deserve action.

Call for Investigation

The allegations being raised are not trivial matters. Biological warfare and human trafficking are crimes of the highest order, and they require serious attention at the state level. Governor Kelly's administration, being the governing body responsible for overseeing state safety, must be investigated for its role in allowing these issues to continue unchecked. Whether through action, inaction, or oversight failures, the state bears responsibility for what happens within its borders.

An investigation into Governor Laura Kelly's administration is not just about assigning blame; it is about ensuring that no one, no matter how high up in power, is above the law. If there are failures in her administration that have allowed biological threats or trafficking to persist, those failures must be uncovered and corrected. The state of Kansas cannot afford to turn a blind eye to such serious allegations, and neither can the citizens of Crawford County or Kansas as a whole. The truth must come out, no matter where it leads, and those responsible for these atrocities, whether through direct involvement or negligence, must be brought to justice.

Section 4: President Joe Biden – Political Allegations and Local Repercussions

dysfunction and corruption at the national level, it deepens their sense of hopelessness about their own local struggles. The accusations of dementia against Biden, whether legitimate or not, serve as a symbol of a broader issue: the feeling that those in power are not fully capable of serving the needs of the people.

In a town where corruption has long been part of the fabric of local governance, there's a palpable sense that the same kind of neglect and abuse of power permeates the national scene. Just as local officials like Tom Moody have used their positions to enrich themselves and their inner circle, residents see a parallel in the way national politics seem to be driven by special interests rather than the well-being of the average citizen. Section 5: Fighting Back – A Community in Crisis

My Recovery:

After the violent attack I endured in Tom Moody's bar, I was left not only with physical scars but with deep emotional wounds. The damage to my body was severe—I had a cracked cervical vertebra that left me in chronic pain for years. To cope with that pain, I was prescribed Oxycontin, a powerful opioid. What followed was a decade-long struggle, not just with the physical agony but with the

emotional weight of betrayal by my own community. I had been hurt by people who were supposed to serve and protect, and that sense of abandonment weighed heavily on me.

For ten long years, I battled not only the addiction to the medication that was meant to help me heal but also the sense of isolation that came from feeling powerless against a corrupt system. Every day, I was reminded of the violent attack and the indifferent response of local authorities. But despite it all, I survived. And survival, in this case, was more than just physical endurance—it was about finding the strength to rise above the pain, to regain control of my life, and to fight back against the forces that sought to silence me.

My recovery is a testament to my resolve. It wasn't easy. It took years of inner strength and determination to move past the darkness and addiction. But here I am, standing, not just for myself but for every other person who has been wronged by this corrupt system. Crawford County is not just my home—it's the home of countless people who have suffered in silence. This fight is not just about me anymore; it's about all of us. I'm here to be a voice for those who can't speak up, for those who have been silenced by violence, corruption, and intimidation.

A Community Divided:

What's happening in Crawford County is not just a personal battle—it's a fight for the very soul of our community. This is a local war, but it's a war with real consequences for every single person who lives here. Families are divided, torn apart by the corruption that seeps into every part of life here. And then there are the rest of us—the ones who live with the consequences of their actions. The ones who are ignored, silenced, and harmed. The people of Crawford County deserve better than this. We deserve a government that works for everyone, not just the elite few.

We can no longer allow this small group of individuals to control our future. It's time to stand up and fight back, not just for ourselves, but for our neighbors, for our children, and for the future of this town. This local war may be ugly, but it's one we have to fight.
