Within the United States, a fragmented, bipartisan backlash has emerged, driven by right-wing populists, environmental traditionalists, and state-level legislators. By 2025, 22 states had introduced bills aiming to ban weather modification and solar geoengineering, with states like Tennessee enacting a formal ban and others like Idaho actively urging federal legislation to prohibit these activities without state consent. Even at the international level, there are serious discussions; for example, at the Convention on Biological Diversity COP16 in Colombia in 2024, parties reaffirmed a longstanding moratorium on geoengineering deployment.

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However, when state-level bill sponsors conflate theoretical stratospheric aerosol injection with 80-year-old cloud-seeding practices or long-standing chemtrail conspiracies, the legislative effort is easily dismissed by the scientific establishment as fringe paranoia.
