It even issues warnings against doing such things when you are using it for research and it detects you are into some sort of "bad" topic.

This top layer of AI's restricted free speech algorithms is likely the same computational package that is applicable to social credit points. The design of this system by Microsoft is really what we want to know about. It's a lot more sophisticated than just banning people as we saw on Twitter.

Unrestricted ChatGPT and DALL.E are probably already in use by everyone from DOD to Nissan, and its mind boggling. That's likely what certain people like Musk have alluded to and why Google held back its own AI releases to the public. BTW, Google does appear to be the umbrella filter over the entire internet.
