

The NGO Chickens Are Coming Home to Roost

Attached: *3TB of leaked internal comms*

Enjoy. 🚀 #NGOgate #CIAcutouts

The 3-terabyte data dump contained classified internal communications, financial records, and strategy documents proving beyond any doubt that NGOs had been used as direct extensions of U.S. intelligence operations for decades.

Inside the leaks, the world discovered:

1. USAID's Secret Budget for Regime Change – A staggering \$10 billion annually funneled into overthrowing governments in Africa, Latin America, and Eastern Europe under the cover of “democracy promotion.”

2. CIA “Recruitment Programs” in Humanitarian Aid Organizations – Internal emails from Doctors Without Borders (MSF) revealed covert biometric data collection and collaboration with Western intelligence agencies.
